### Extreme Weather Arrangements

I am writing to inform you that an extreme heat warning has been issued for London this week and to outline the impact this will have on our school and having spoken with other Headteachers this morning.

The health, safety and wellbeing of our pupils and staff are our highest priority. We have therefore taken the decision to implement temporary measures to reduce the risks associated with the high temperatures. Thursday's trip day will run as planned and Friday will be a normal school day as the weather should be cooler.

However, for Tuesday and Wednesday we are adjusting the days as follows:

#### Tuesday:

- **Years 7, 8, 10 and 12** will have a normal morning and we will start to dismiss students at **12.30pm**. Lunch will be available up to 1.00pm but the gates will open for students to leave at 12.30pm.
- **Year 9** will sit the RE exam P1 and 2 and then be dismissed from 11.30am via Byron Street. Lunch will be available before Year 9 leave. The Spanish exam scheduled for the afternoon will now take place on Friday morning.

#### Wednesday:

- Gates will be open for students to be dismissed at 12.30pm but lunch will be available up to 1.00pm

#### Thursday:

- Trips days will run as planned.

For all students, please use resources and learning available on Google Classroom for the afternoon. We appreciate that this may well impact upon childcare arrangements so do contact the school if needed.

To help keep children safe and comfortable during the hot weather, we ask that you support us by ensuring that your child brings a water bottle to school each day. Other drinks are not permitted in school.

We appreciate your cooperation and understanding as we take these precautionary measures. We will continue to monitor the situation and will keep you informed should any further changes be necessary. As it stands the weather should be cooler on Friday and we will have a normal day on Friday.
