

Anti- Bullying Campaign



Friendship bullying is just that, a friend who bullies another friend. Sometimes adults call this "relational bullying" since it is happening within a relationship between two people. No matter what you call it, this is bullying. This type of bullying can happen to anyone, at any age!



Discuss:

How can friendship bullying start from banter? What are the potential harms of friendship bullying? (Both for the victim and for the wider group of friends?)

Why might friendship bullying happen?

Friendship bullying includes:

- Verbal abuse, such as name-calling and gossiping
- Threatening, intimidating or humiliating behaviour (for example, "If you tell on us, we'll tell everyone you're a baby who's afraid of the dark")
- Excluding someone from the friendship group; leaving them out of plans;
 whispering behind their back
- Undermining someone, by spreading rumours or constantly criticizing them ('I don't know why we let you hang around with us; we're so much prettier than you/better at sports than you')
- Controlling or manipulating ('If you don't let me copy your maths homework, I won't be your friend any more')
