I will take opportunities to try new things, participate and work without supervision.








Break and Lunch



OUT OF BOUNDS

- All areas highlighted in red are out of bounds during <u>break</u> and <u>lunch</u>.
- You are <u>NOT</u> permitted to stand/sit around in the <u>basketball courts.</u>
- Students can be seated on the concourse.
- Spotlight is out of bounds apart from sixth form students who can use the games room.
- Students found inside the building or in an out of bounds area will receive a same day 60 minute detention.



QUIET GARDEN

A welfare pass must be signed off and collected **from inclusion or Ms Kampiyawo.**


YEAR GROUP AREAS



Anti- Bullying Campaign




This term, we are focusing on being an upstander and not a bystander.
