

Catch-Up Funding Report

2018-19

The Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium provides schools and academies with additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading and / or mathematics at the end of KS2. The details of the funding can be found by clicking on this link

For the academic year Langdon Park received £20,000 to support pupils who started KS3 with lower than expected attainment in literacy and numeracy.

The key areas the funding was used:

2 Specialist TSs working with English and maths are now NQTs.

TAs provided 1:1 and small group support for pupils in English and maths.

TAs created specific and personalized resources for use in class and at home.

Ruth Miskin language and comprehension programme.

Nurture group in learning support.

Accelerated Reader Programme

Cohort

We identified 30 pupils for additional maths support and 53 for additional reading intervention based upon KS2 scores, baseline assessments and reading data.

Impact

The group will continue to be closely tracked into Year 8 through HOY and ESS programme.

Pupils are tracked against a Flight Path model to achieve a grade 5 in English and maths at GCSE.
