

ENRICHMENT

PASTORAL SUPPORT

All students are part of a form group, and the tutors and sixth form team offer pastoral support as a first point of contact. There is a Well-Being Group on Google Classroom where students can raise concerns. There is an excellent support system for students, with access to an Inclusion Team, including Counselling support and a school-based Social Worker.

CAREER SUPPORT

LPS has a full-time Careers and Enrichment Coordinator who supports all students with career choices and transition. Students are supported with the UCAS process and early applications for subjects such as medicine and Oxbridge applicants.

LPS students have successfully secured places at Oxbridge and other Russell Group universities. Students are advised on apprenticeships and attend events to ensure they are well informed. Pupil engagement is tracked, and tutors play an active role in supporting students who require support and guidance.

Student leadership is developed through pupil voice roles, work placement opportunities, and leading school initiatives.

Trips: There are multiple opportunities for trips throughout the school year.

LANGDON PATHWAY

All of our Key Stage Five Pathways are designed to support pupils by helping them choose a pathway suited to their needs and aspirations!

TRADITIONAL MIXED TECHNICAL

Three A levels: Applicants for Medicine, Dental and Oxbridge Universities. "I am an aspirant Oxbridge Dental or Medicine student. My GCSE were grades 7s and above, including English and Math's!"

MIXED

A levels and/or Level 3 Vocational Subjects.

"I achieved mainly grades 6 and above, including English and Math's at GCSE!"

TECHNICAL

Level 3 Vocational Subjects.

"I passed most of my GCSEs, and I would like to study a vocational course to prepare me for a particular profession and resit English and Math's where necessary!"

APPLICATION PROCESS

Read through this prospectus.

- 1. Pick 3 subjects you are interested in studying; please carefully check the entry criteria for each by the deadline. Please note students can change their subject choices at any time during this academic year.
- 2. Meet with a member of our Senior Leadership Team to discuss their subject choices and possible future pathways. Invitation letters will be sent at the end of December.
- 3. Complete the online registration form before the interviews, which will be held in January.



FAQ

FIRST QUESTION TO ASK 'IS THE SIXTH FORM FOR ME'?

For most students, the answer to this question is simple – YES!

Our Sixth Form offers various courses for students of all abilities. Employers are looking for skilled, educated young people capable of meeting the demands imposed by technological progress.

PART-TIME JOBS

If you enter the Sixth Form, you must devote sufficient time to your studies to give you a good chance of being successful. For this reason, students who undertake part-time work need to ensure that this does not interfere with their studies. We recommend that students do not work more than 10 hours per week and only after 4 p.m. or weekends.

PROGRESSION

Whatever your choice of course in the Sixth Form, there must be a clear progression route for you on completion of your studies. We aim to ensure that all courses provide students with opportunities to continue to develop their interests and skills following their time with us.

LIFE IN THE SIXTH FORM

You will find that life in the Sixth Form differs from the school life you have undertaken in previous years. The key to success is responsibility. The onus is on you to decide your course of study and your involvement in extra-curricular activities.

You will be expected to study independently and manage your study time appropriately. Sixth-form students studying academic courses are scheduled to complete at least 15 hours of private study per week (which includes private study sessions in school).

High standards of punctuality and attendance are required just as if you were in employment. Students are expected to conform to the Sixth Form dress code, and as a Sixth Former, you will be expected to set an example to the rest of the school.
